Tell us a little bit about yourself

I'm from Norfolk, Massachusetts and I am currently a senior at Emmanuel College majoring in History and Secondary Education and my hobbies include travel and photography. I first decided to attend Emmanuel College because I wanted to go to school in the city of Boston, but also have that small college community and atmosphere. I studied abroad for the academic year of 2013-2014 at Trinity College in Dublin, Ireland. I'd say that my biggest challenge while studying abroad was making the decision to go for an entire year as opposed to your average one semester. I wanted to study abroad for the full year in order to fully immerse myself in the culture of Ireland as well as to gain familiarity with the city of Dublin and be able to travel extensively throughout Europe.

What was most challenging about studying abroad? What did you learn about yourself?

Making this decision was difficult for me for several reasons. I'd never left the United States before, so I knew there would be a strong element of unfamiliarity in stepping outside my comfort zone. Also, I'd never been away from my family and friends for so long, and not having that support system nearby to be able to fall back on was an intimidating thought.
