

Street Safety Tips

- When on the street, walk facing oncoming traffic.
- Tell someone where you'll be and what time you're supposed to return, or if you will be with someone you don't know well.
- Try to not overload yourself with packages.
- Do not wear headphones or talk on cell phone while walking or jogging. Stay alert.
- If you wear a purse with a shoulder strap, be prepared to let it go if snatched.
- If someone asks you for directions, and if you choose to reply, remain at least two arms lengths away.
- Avoid being on the street alone if you are upset or under the influence of drugs or alcohol, or have someone go with you.
- Walk with your head up making eye contact.
- Remember try never to walk anywhere alone.

Car and Bike Safety Tips

- Check the inside and around your car before entering to insure that no one is hiding there.
- Park or ride in well-lit, heavily traveled areas.
- Securely lock your car or bike.
- Don't leave valuables in plain sight.
- When riding your bike always remember to wear a helmet.
- When riding a bike, ride with the flow of traffic.

General Safety Tips

- Create personal safety plan
- Listen to and act on your intuition. It's better to be safe and risk a little embarrassment, than stay in an uncomfortable situation that may be unsafe.
- If you are in danger or being attacked and want to get help, yell "Call 911!" or "You! Get the police!"
- Have your keys ready when approaching your car or entering a building.
- Vary your routine by driving or walking different routes every day.
- If you suspect that someone is following you, go to a public place to call the police, or go directly to a police station.
- Do not label keys with your name or any other form of identification.
- Don't talk about your social life or travel plans where strangers can overhear you and do not put them out for the public on social networking sites.
- Program your campus safety phone number in your cell phone.

"T" Safety Tips

- Stay awake and alert.
- Have exact change or your Charlie Card ready.
- Try to sit near the driver.
- If you sense someone is following you when you get off, walk toward a populated area. Do not walk directly home.
